

OKLAHOMA ANTENNA DEFENSE FUND

An Oklahoma City amateur radio operator has filed suit against the City of Oklahoma City in U.S. Federal Court for the Western District of Oklahoma. This amateur operator alleges that the City has no legal right to RESTRICT his freedom of operation through arbitrary antenna height restrictions. As you may know, Oklahoma City has a maximum 50 foot limitation on all radio antennas/towers.

This case will have serious and important ramifications for Oklahoma and the rest of the

United States since it will be heard in a Federal Court. If this Ham is successful, then ALL
hams will benefit. Contributions to pay the



Last week was a good one because I finally got home for an indeterminate time. Two days were spent in Atlantic City NJ and I walked away from the slot machines with more coins than I started with.





# DOWN TO DALLAS -- HAMCOM STYLE

I don't think that I appreciate the trip to Dallas in early June as much for the hamfest at the North Park Inn as much as I appreciate the opportunity to trek over to Southern Kitchen restaurant with a large group of friends, ogle the barmaids and stuff large quantities of boiled shrimp down my throat. But the hamfest, Dallas HamCom, offers some attraction at least in the fleamarket and commercial exhibits department. And this year, although I didn't spend much money in the fleamarket, I at least got change for my ticket purchase when I won a prize. It was a small prize, mind you, but worth about \$30.00 or so. I guess if you count the air transportation down to Dallas and the meal that evening, I didn't make a profit, but I could get lucky at Ham Holiday. After all, this could be an omen.

After Dayton, the trip to Dallas HamCom is considerably less exciting, but this hamfest in the heart of "Big D" continues to grow. Actually, the hamfest is really just a glorified sidewalk sale (a regular first saturday of the month event in "Big D") with some programs and commercial exhibits thrown in for good measure. I couldn't get Joe K5JB excited about the trip because he was getting ready to do some heavy travelling in his own right and I could understand his relunctance to tire himself out the weekend before he left. Nevertheless, I did enlist Joe WA5FLT, who is already ready to go anywhere, with or without notice, Jim WD5HPU, a newcomer to Dallas and the airplane, and Tim WA5LTM, who had been in on a couple of previous efforts to go to the sidewalk sale that had been scrubbed by bad weather. Tim would finally get his chance.

This was no lightweight crew for the airplane. In fact, I had to leave about 18 gallons of fuel on the ground. This was more of a safety factor than any tribute to weight of the crew. Even though we would have pushing gross weight in the 172 XP considerably with these boys, especially if I decided to take along my 20 lb flight bag, we didn't have any trouble getting up in the air and climbing. I was glad however, that I made sure that the plane had plenty of air in the tires. That kind of weight changes the horizon when everybody gets in.

We had planned to meet at the airport and if the weather was inadequate, then the plan was to motor down in the car. First call was to be at 6:00 a.m., but as the warm front began to dissipate friday nite, I called everybody and told them that we would chose a more natural departure time of 6:30 a.m. That time of day usually comes only once for me, but our serious intentions about Dallas made me move the alarm up a couple of hours. I stopped by the Doughnut Stop on the way to the airport for a dozen or so, just to tide us over until breakfast. I figured any weight we put on during the flight wouldn't change the gross weight, just the weight and balance.

The skies were very hazy, especially after the warm front, but the air was very smooth and we didn't have a single bump until the plane set down at Dallas Love. I had already made a request to the communications crew in the back to call Jim WB5YWO who had offered us ground transportation when he motored through Norman the day before with the family. I was going to have breakfast with him on friday, but a change in the signals messed that up (you would think that people with radios would have that happen to them, but it does) and we settled for a visit at my office which is just off the interstate. After a hour and a half and a short 15 minute car ride, we unloaded at the site.

The weather cooperated quite well, but it was still just a little hot. We spend quite a bit of time in the air conditioned part of the flea market and then even ventured into the commercial exhibits. I also worked on my tan outside in the parking lot checking out all the goodies. Before separating, we divied up the radios for communications purposes. We were using frequencies on both UHF and VHF. Tim did not have a walkie talkie, so I gave him one of mine for the day. Actually, he did not need it all day. Before the noonday had arrived, he was the proud owner of an IC2AT with accessories. Now the radio was one thing. 'The accessories were another. Tim asked me what he needed to go with the radio. ## GE MASTER II EXCITER CAVEATS


Upon a recommendation a couple of years ago of our friend. Dwight down in Altus, I bought a couple of exciters for the General Electric Master II and Excecutive series radios at Dayton. In the flea market, these were about \$50.00 or so and they make an excellent low power UHF link. One of the radios out of the three was sold to K5JB who felt that he did not purchase enough of them and the other two were put on the shelf for eventual use. That came the other day when the old Progress line UHF transmitter crapped out and I thought it was time to go all solid state on my UHF control link repeater. I had fortunately acquired the documentation for these devices and I pulled it out to see what it would take to get one of them tuned up. Fortunately I had purchased a crystal some time ago.

I think that I had mentioned these devices in the C & E a couple of times. GE makes a complete little UHF transmitter in these exciters. They put about about 250 milliwatts and are just perfect for driving the Motorola MHW 710 and 720 Monolithic Gain blocks to provide 10 or 20 watts of UHF power.


As I was looking through the literature that I had acquired, I noticed that one of the models of exciters was one tripler short to get to UHF if you multiplied 36 times like you are suppose. A quick check showed that neither of my transmitters were like this, but it is something to beware of when purchasing these in the flea market. It appears that GE has begun to move the last tripler in to the power amplifier deck on the later models of these radios. The numbers are different. The Master II exciter that you are looking for is a 19D423865G2 or G4. This is a 4 frequency exciter with UHF output. The Master Exec Exciter is also good and the number for it is a 19D423346G1 & G2. It also has the correct number of multiplier stages for UHF. Stay away from the 19D416859G5 & G8 versions or you will be one tripler short. These numbers are illustrative. I do not have a complete literature collection to give you all the various numbers. It is possible that GF may use a VHF exciter in their UHF transmitters because that cuts down on the parts count, then they add a tripler in the power amplifier to get up to UHF, but I don't know. Perhaps somebody out there with a complete set of books can let us know. As usual, caveat emptor in the flea market.


I had previously mentioned the Intersil ICL7660 in the May 1980 issue of C & E as a method of deriving negative voltage from a positive voltage source. The previous circuit only showed how to convert 5 volts to -5 volts, but there are other uses to the chip. Actually the chip will work with any voltage range from +1.5 to 8 Volts and will produce corresponding voltages of -1.5 to 8 volts. The circuit requires only two external capacitors and is shown as follows:




The converters can be cascaded to perform negative supply voltage multiplication as shown below. The practical limit is 10 devices for light loads. Although I have not tried it, it occurrs to me that less and less current would be supplied each time you multiplied. The conversion accuracy is about 98% ( $R_1 = 5 \text{K ohms}$ ) and the  $I_{out}$  is greater than 40 mils ( $R_1 = 55$  ohms). The more current you draw the lower the voltage on the output (a change in the conversion accuracy). For minus voltage doubling, the circuit is as follows:



Positive voltage doubling is also one of the magic tricks that can be performed by the 7660. This can be done over the V+ range from 5 V to 8 V. The actual output voltage will be slightly less than 2 V+ by an amount equal to the forward voltage drops across  $D_1$  and  $D_2$ :



Now here is a real trick. Negative voltage conversion and positive voltage multiplication can be performed simultaneously to produce one output with a negative supply voltage equal to the positive supply voltage and a second output equal to twice the positive supply voltage.



The chips are about \$2.25 each in minidip from Intersil. They are CMOS and are also available in TO-99.


# MONOLITHIC TOUCH TONE DECODERS -- Part II (You've Got to Ring Dem Touchtones)

I briefly mentioned a couple of the new generation of touchtone decoders last month including the Silicon Systems Incorporated SSI201 CMOS DTMF decoder which only requires two bypass capacitors and a crystal to operate providing BCD or Row and column information. I also mentioned the new CMOS prefilter from AMI which is digitally operated using switched capacitor filter technology and can work in conjunction with the Mostek MK5102 or the other decoders that don't have a prefilter. Schematics for typical circuits were shown and as I have indicated, I have laid out a card for the AMI Mostek combination which I have not received yet.

Switched capacitor filters is the new quantum leap in filters and it is a tribute to american ingenuity (or whoever came up with it). Filter technology has come a long way. Our forefathers spent a lot of time with LC filters and RC circuits when they wanted bandpass, low pass or high pass filters. The odvious problem was bulk, but the way old time circuits were constructed on large breadboards, this was not really a problem. One of the first advances after that were gyrators in which capacitors and inductors were placed in the feedback loops of amplifiers and the values of the circuits could be multiplied and capacitors could be made into inductors of fairly large values. Trouble with these devices is that using vacuum tubes with all the attendant heat and what not made them very unstable. The improvements in transistors and the loss of heat made gyrators what was happening, filterwise, for some time. Then the evolution of the op amp produced active filters and those were quite hot until the emergence of the switched capacitor filter. Active filters were OK, but they were tricky to tune and required precision resistor and capacitor values. You could obtain multiple poles, but only by cascading a lot of filters in series, then tuning each of them separately. Temperature stability of components just like the gyrator was critical and placing active filters in areas of RF energy without proper shielding was a no no.

The problem associated with designing adequate filters at audio has always been with us. The values of inductors and capacitors at audio frequencies has required fairly large size components. Likewise when op amps and LSI came along, the technology did not easily permit large values of Capacitors and resistors on the substrates. Active filters enjoyed some success with laser trimming as a method of tuning hybrid chips (combinations of op amps and special non IC components), but many of us remember the first hybrid tone oscillators for HT's and how the least amount of RF sent these devices into untuned frenzy.

The switched capacitor filter relies on a simple technique that has been mentioned in these pages before and that is if you switch a capacitor between two different voltages, then it can be made to emulate a resistor which will be a function of the value of the capacitor and the frequency.



If we say that at T=0, the capacitor is switched to the left, then the voltage on the capacitor is  $V_1$  and the charge at  $T=\emptyset$  is given by

$$T = 0$$
, then charge on  $C = CV_1$ 

If the switch is switched to the right, at T = T2

then the capacitor has V2 volts across it at T = T2, then the charge in the capacitor is given by

$$T = T_2$$
 then charge on  $C = CV_2$ 

the current that flows in (or out) of the capacitor from the time from T<sub>1</sub> to T<sub>2</sub> is equal to the change in the charge divided by the time or

$$i = \frac{Q(T_2) - Q(T_1)}{T_2 - T_1}$$

which is equal to

$$i = \frac{C(V_2 - V_1)}{T_C}$$

where  $T_C = T_2 - T_1$  which is also equal to the inverse of the frequency where  $T_2 - T_1$  is the period. 1/Period is equal to Frequency, so

$$i = C (V_2 - V_1) F_C$$

where Fc is the switching frequency.

If we rearrange the values of the equation, then we can show an equivalent resistance (of the voltage versus current variety) that is equal to

$$R_{eq} = \frac{V_2 - V_1}{i} = \frac{1}{C F_c}$$

And this is how a capacitor can be made to look like an equivalent resistor is it is switched between two voltages. Notice that the final equation is independent of voltage. This is something that an active filter can't boast as many parameters of an active filter can change with voltage.

Effective resistors can be designed that ordinarily could not be used on an integrated substrate. Which me ans that active filters can be designed using switched capacitor techniques that might have as many as forty poles of filtering. Redicon, one of the companies in the forefront is designing filters with up to 100 poles per chip! Once we have achieved the necessary resistor values using these techniques, the only limitations then become the size of the chip itself and manufacturing accuracy.

Although Redicon makes a variety of modem and universal filters, the subject is DTMF prefilters. As I indicated last month, the AMI prefilter and the SSI complete digital receiver both used switched capacitor technology.

Mitel also uses switched capacitors in their DTMF decoder, a two chip set known as the MT8865 and MT8860. The MT8865 is a switched capacitor prefilter operating over a range of 4.5 to 13 volts. Its dynamic range is 30 db and its input impedence is 10 Megohm. At 5 volts, it draws 1.2 ma. and dissipates only from 0 db to -30 db.


The MT 88:0 Digital Decoder is similiar to the Mostek 5102 but it operates over a supply range of 4.5 to 15 volts and draws less than 1.0 ma. It will accept Signal to Noise ratios of 14 db and the tone bandwidth is +2.5%. The decode time is 30 milliseconds and this is adjustable.

A complete circuit is shown the following page. The circuit is quite simple and uses a minimum of parts. Typical performance is fairly similiar to the other decoders I have mentioned. The crystal is a color burst crystal on 3.58 Mhz and a single crystal can be used to drive both the switched capacitor prefilter and digital decoder.

The Mitel chip sets offer lower current consumption, so it theoritically could be driven from a telephone line directly rather than having to supply all the

Separate voltages as required by the AMI and Mostek. The Mitel chips are a little harder to get because Mitel is a supplier to the telephone industry. The AMI parts are available for the most part from several of the local big time parts distributors. The mitel chips are also a little more expensive. Both the Mostek Chip and the AMI chip can be obtained for just a little over \$40.00. Mitel is about half again as much.

I also didn't find about the Mitel until I was already into the card making stage. It would really not be very difficult to convert to Mitel and I am thinking about it sometime. WA5JXX had made a fairly complete study of Touch tone decoders for a project he was working on and concluded that the Mitel was the superior decoder at this time. He also ordered a couple of sets so if I can talk him into borrowing a set for a prototype, it might not be to difficult to ink up a set of boards.

I have intentionally limited this discussion to the switched capacitor filter and digital type decoders, especially of the CMOS variety. For the most part, the use of hybrid circuits is OK, but the switched capacitor technology is cheaper and better. I have seen some Telaris hybrid touchtone decoders going in the flea market for \$25.00 apiece or so, but this is surplus material that is finding its way into the market as the hybrids are being replaced by switched capacitors.

Down in Dallas, I saw a fellow who was selling the Collins CRC 8030 touch tone decoders (without prefilters) for just \$12.50. This was quite a largain, but the collins chip is a 28 pin dual in line and is just a little difficult to operate with. It would work well with the AMI chip and has some good features. For somebody wanting to build up a junk box decoder, this was a good buy.

Mitel supplies a DTMF receiver comparison chart which summarizes all the various parameters. It is shown on the following pages. They show three categories of devices.

The first category is the Decoder only. This is the device without a prefilter. For the most part, these are CMOS IC's using crystals and they digitally time the incoming signals. Each requires a prefilter to properly operate and requires an input from a bandsplitting filter. The charts also include a couple of devices that I have not previously discussed including the Teltone TT t174 which is housed in a 40 pin behemoth.

hybrids. The ITT packages were shown in a circuit and construction project in the January 1982 issue of QST. Only the prefilters were used. The disadvantage of the ITT prefilters is that they are hybrids and consequently more expensive (about \$10.00 or so or \$30.00 for each of the two bandpass filters). It can be seen that in this sweepstakes, the Mitel wins hands down with the power dissipation department. Note that the dialtone rejection is greater for the AMI S3525 because it contains a special dial tone rejection filter rather than relying on the bandpass filters. 52 db is considerable, but 30 db of the Mitel is nothing to sneeze at. Mitel offers a circuit in their Ap Notes to show how to get the dial tone down further if desired.

The third comparison is the complete tone receiver. This is both the prefilter and digital detector on a single chip package. Mitel is showing their new switched capacitor filters as an example and in comparison with the other single chip receivers.

It can be seen on comparison that the two chip set is again superior and the inconvenience of the extra parts and assembly is probably not significant when measured against the advantages of the Mitel chip set. I have a couple of the SSI 201 receivers and we used one of the Telaris Hybrids for several years in the old K5HMD remote base. some trouble with it because of sensitivity to noise. Joe finally wound up disabling the speech detector portion of the circuitry to prevent it from disabling the decoder. After that, it worked acceptably. Apparently Telaris signaled and detected out of band noise to determine if "speech" was present on the input. If it was, then it would inhibit the decoder. The only problem is that in a radio system, you will have other out of band noise that will also show up as "speech" from the squelch or perhaps a noisy signal. This would affect decoder reliability. I really would not recommend the Telaris chip in a radio circuit unless the "speech" detector is disabled.

Maybe next month I will have my prototype board using the Mostek/AMI chip set up and running and we can run some schematics and a board layout. If not, then it could be a couple of months after that. I will probably lay out a card using the Mitel chip set. It's price should start coming down a little.







### ESTIMATING WIND SPEED

From time to time one has reason to have an idea on just how hard the wind is blowing. A big antenna party is one example. There are many suggestions available, but most involve smoke drift or other means which are not always at hand here in Oklahoma.

One way of estimating wind speed is readily available, at least here in the land of balmy breezes. It is also one which nearly always attracts the attention of the amateur wind expert. The following guide is therefore offered so that all may know which way the wind blows.

0-5 knots Silk blouse - any movement will be caused by the occupant.

5-1- knots Silk blouse - movement by occupant may be slightly distortedby wind.

10-20 kts Light synthetic blouse and/or skirt show curves beneath.

20-30 kts. Cotton and heavy synthetic skirts and blouses show hidden curves; light skirts start to lift.

30-40 kts Loose fitting pants start to flutter; heavy skirts start to lift.

40-50 kts Wool skirts may blow above waist.

50-60 kts Unhaltered 36C, and 38D, start to flutter.

60-70 kts Light cotton and synthetic blouses start to blow away.

70-80 kts. Haltered 36C, and 38D, start to flap.

80-90 kts Unhaltered 36B, flatten completely when facing into the wind.

90-100 kts Unhaltered 44D, flatten completely when facing into the wind.

Over 100kts; Heavy sweat suits show hidden curves.

### THE JUNE MEETING ALREADY???.....

The regular monthly meeting of SCARS was held on Saturday, June 12, 1982 at the Red Cross building in Norman. The president, KU5B, called the meeting to order. W5SQJ was first to gain the floor with his motion that the meeting be adjourned. The motion died for lack of a second, and W5SQJ was warned that one more suggestion of that nature would gain him a toss into the mud hole. Wb5UUX gave the Treasurer's report and also the CORA report. The EC report from AF5X followed. W5MCJ reported that the club station was/is in good working order.

The ARRL affiliation plans are apparently going along on schedule according to letters which have been received by KU5B. Jack then gave the floor to W5SQJ (along with a reminder about the mud hole). Jess then said that the club will hold Field Day operations from the sight at the Red Cross on June 26-27. Since the committee still had not found a generator, the club voted to buy a generator from the treasury. KU5B volunteered to look for one which has a price not to exceed the agreed limit.

KU5B, Jack , gave the club a good program on the basics for Field Day operation.

## HOW HIGH IS THE WATER MAMA (glub)?.....

Some members of SCARS were called into action on May 19, 1982 when the South Canadian River began to rise and approach the flood stage due to heavy rains upstream. N5DWN and W5MCJ, along with WB5UUX were first into action. Ford, W5AIP, called AF5X, the emergency coordinator. Before the evening was over, several area amateurs had taken part in maintaining watch on the river as well as monitoring the situation at the emergency shelter for the Red Cross. The stations which acted as net controls during the activity were: N5DWN, KA5COI, N5ALG, and W5MCJ.

Fortunatly, relatively little actual flooding took place and evacuations were minimum.

# ZEDD CERTIFIED AS UNIQUELY SUPERIOR OPERATOR

In an unprecedented but obviously praiseworthy move, the FCC has made a significant change in its incentive licensing system, and has given the first callsign allocation in the new series to Oklahoma's greatest, Q.R. Zedd.

Henceforth, Zedd, whose exploits during the January 3CØ expedition finally stirred the FCC to action, will be known on the bands by the nation's first modern one-by-one, A5A.

"I am honored to be given the nation's first modern one-by-one callsign," said the modest Zedd in a telephone interview from his home QTH, Honor Roll Ranch south of Norman. "However, the honor is certainly -- in all modesty -- nothing more than I richly deserve."

The FCC is expected to announce momentarily that others may attempt to win the new license class ranking above the Amateur Extra, to be known as Amateur Superhuman. Some of the test criteria have been leaked in Washington and they include the following:

MORSE CODE REQUIREMENT: demonstrated ability to send on a hand key and receive perfect copy for a period of one hour at 100 WPM. A blunt pencil must be used.

THEORY REQUIREMENT: a grade of 95 or better on a six-hour written essay test

covering, but not limited to, everything that has ever been said about electronics, spaceship technology, raising orchids and junk collecting.

PRACTICAL REQUIREMENT: The applicant must go to a Radio Shack store of his choice and there select the necessary parts to go home and within a period of 72 hours construct and successfully launch an Oscar satellite.

It is understood that numerous complaints have already been received at FCC headquarters from those saying the easy test will cheapen this most coveted license. There has also been a letter from Wayne Green, saying there should be no license tests at all.

Zedd, long known as the greatest among all but the most myopic, finally caught the FCC's attention, as was stated earlier, during the 3Cd expedition. Zedd did not go, but he was among the policemen sitting on Martha's transmit frequency Thursday afternoon, January 28, when an operator in 2-land came on the frequency as he had every afternoon at 2100Z, operating a laughing machine and CW keyer running at random.

Zedd, of course, joined the others in condemning these nerdly practices, and in fact completely covered the frequency for four minutes with a brilliant speech. When he unkeyed, however, the 2-nerd had been joined by a 4-nerd doing much the same stuff and running a telephone busy signal as well.

Unfortunately for the 4-nerd, this broke Zedd's legendary patience and he unveiled a bit of electronic wizardly which was then only in the testing stages.

Zedd activated a new, experimental direction-finding device using a pair of triangulated 32-element 15-meter quads on 350-foot towers at opposite ends of Honor Roll. After getting readings, he called his friend and sometimes-critic, the great Bill Blast (of the daily Blast Off DX net) on a discreet frequency and got a beam heading from the Pacific northwest which dovetailed exactly with his own readings. Zedd thus had the 4-land nerdly culprit pinpointed within a circle of plus or minus 18 inches.

Bringing the power of his biggest linear amplifier up to snuff (although he never dips the nasty stuff himself, preferring genuine latakia pipe tobacco roasted -- as genuine latakia must be -- over Syrian camel dung), Zedd then switched off the dummy load to one of his modest antennas in order to call the offending 4-nerd and read him the riot act.

the basic calculation is as follows:

T=D(nm)xK/F+SA/ti-pi-Z where T is of course the tilt angle above the horizontal; D represents the great circle distance to the targeted station in nautical miles; K represents the latest Boulder Kindex; F is the frequency in MHz; SA is the sun angle at the equator; ti is local time; pi are square (whereas cornbread are round), and Z stands for GMT. Calculation of the sun angle at the equator, a crucial part of the calculations, is at present a secret and (C) Q.R. Zedd, Inc., Honor Roll Ranch, PO Box 73, Norman, Okla., 73070.

Well, to make a long story short, a horrific blue bolt of rf was seen to crash into the antenna farm at the QTH, of the nerdly 4. We will, however, pursue this matter even though Zedd's latest ascension would tend to prove that there is only one who is The Greatest.)



The weather warning form found in this issue may be Xeroxed to use as a reference during severe weather. The format of the bulletins issued on the OCAPA 22/82 repeater by the National Weather Service will correspond to the form for easy copying.


This form is currently in use at all the media outlets served by the amateur operators, plus at National Weather Service, National Severe Storms Lab, Red Cross, and state, county and city civil defense E.O.C.'s.

By issuing this "pre-warning" the amateur network can save one to five minutes over the teletype system, plus assuring a backup in the event of failure of that system.

Only counties served by the Oklahoma City NWS office appear on the form. They are in alphabetical order. In general practice, it has been found efficient to place a checkmark or an "X" in the blank beside the county if the whole county is included. If a section of a county is included, write in "SE", "S\2", or "NE1/3" to eliminate any errors.

Blanks at the bottom may be used to check the source of your information or to log times of relays ot other repeaters. Time of issue and date may be logged in the upper right.

PHONE BAND EXPANSION - YES OR NO ???

Those of you who read my May article will recall the article on the FCC proposed article on expansion of the 20 meter phone band to include 14.150 to 14.200 MHz. This combination NOI/NPRM is assigned Docket number 82-83. The FCC has extended time on comments for this until August 16. This is mainly because of a request by the ARRL to do so. Editorial neutrality prevents me from expressing my own views in the C & E, but I can encourage everyone to express their comments to the FCC. Most people seem to think that their comments would'nt make a difference one way or another. but they don't realize that a surprisingly small number of people actually send comments to the FCC, making it possible for your comments to actually make a difference. The ARRL has submitted a plan that would give an exclusive extra class subband in this area, but that does'nt seem to matter to Gettysburg. The ARRL plan is said by the League's board of directors as "A compromise between relief of domestic congestion and non-interference to foreign operators already in the segment of 14.150 14.200."

# PRE-REGISTER NOW FOR H H'82 (Use Special Form Inside)



PRODUCT REVIEW - KLM's 13.9 - 14.4A

With the recent rash of "Product Reviews" in the C & E, I thought I would take a crack at a review myself. My contribution to this worthy cause is the KLM 13.9 - 14.4A (KLM has never been much for snappy nicknames like the 'Thunderbird', 'Super Laser', or 'Skywalker').

The 4A is not a huge antenna. It is a 20 meter monobander with four elements on a 23 ft long boom. Optimum spacing for four elements would be closer to 30 feet, but only two of the elements on the 4A are parisitic. The other two are driven and fed to the balun with "phasing straps". This is an attempt to keep the VSWR low and gain bandwith large. I was skeptical about this system at first, but later I found that my suspicions were unfounded.

Assembly time for this antenna is not the same as for some of the more complex KLM arays. The antenna was brought home on a saturday and was ready to go up the following monday! Actual assembly time was on the order of three and a half hours. That includes everything form opening the box to the initial test!

There were no problems during assembly. Instructions were explicit and there were no missing or damaged parts. This was certainly a relief after reading several previous articles on KLM antennas! Only one sour comment could be reported. KLM certainly did not have Oklahoma weather in mind when it designed the antenna's boom to element clamps. These are nothing more than glorified conduit clamps; a far cry from the Hy-Gain and Wilson style boom to element clamps. KLM does recommend that if you live in a high wind area, you should insert a small set screw through the clamp to the boom. Despite some high winds (and some pesky birds roosting on the end of the reflector), there has been no trouble maintaining element alignment.

An initial test was gratifying. The VSWR across the entire band was 1.2 to 1 or less, with absolutely no SWR on the entire 20 meter phone band!

The antenna has been in use for about two months now, and performance has been exceptional for an antenna of this size. Some fairly good DX results have reluted. DX prefixes worked include: S79, VKO, UI8, AP2, JY3, UG6, VS5, FRO, FB8W, KH3, OHO, and 7Q7.

The 4A has certainly met with my satisfaction. If you are planning to stack monobanders, but don't to fool with the 40 foot booms on the big gun antennas, the 4A is for you.





For those not present at the meeting I will include here a few notes on what the CRC system will do, and what it is made from.

\* CPU: 8085AH

\* Memory: EPROM, RAM, & EPROM.

- \* Functions: Autopatch, Repeater timing, (time-out, hang time, & etc.) CW or Voice synthesized identification, remote-base control, noise & kerchunker filtering, audio delay (mutes squelch teil & Touch Tone), Time of day clock, & voice synthesized annoucements.
- \* Special Features: Legal reverse autopatch, with the voice synthesizer annoucing callsign of station being called. Courtesy tones and telemetry tones. Phone number readback and speed dialing. Also 10 emergency speed dialing numbers. Two receiver inputs and two transmitter outputs. Analog measurement capabillity, such as temperature, signal strength, or frequency error. (16 channels of measurement) Remotely configurable by assigned operators. \* And several more items which take time to detail.

Anyway you can see the device does many common repeater controls and then some extra. As far as each member (user) is concerned it will not be that complicated. We will give everyone a new club ID card that will have simple instructions on the back for user functions. The control operators are the ones that will be stuck with a large folder of information. Me and Mike Salem have seen the machine operate and we know you won't be disappointed. If you haven't sent a donation, please call me or Dennis.


