

We have an impending crisis concerning the Norman Veterans Center. The Veteran's Administration had ruled that center will not continue to receive VA funding unless major renovation or replacement is done. Federal funds are available for 65% of the cost of a new center. State funds must be provided for the other 35%, ten million dollars, is included in the proposed bond issue which will be voted on as State Question 649 in the November 3rd, 1992 General Election. The bond issue includes an additional 6.6 million dollars for improvements at the other six veteran centers in the state. If the bond issue does not pass, the Norman Veteran Center, in all probability, will close. One of the means of funding the proposed bond issue is revenue generated by bingo and pull-tabs which will be authorized by the Oklahoma Charity Games Act (Bingo Bill.) This bill will be voted on as State Question 650. Passage of both State Questions 649 and 650 are critical to the future of our Veteran Centers. I ask that each of you work diligently to achieve their passage."

Notes From A New Ham

Commentary about the way things ought to be.

"Invisible airwaves crackle with life, Bright antenna bristle with the energy. Emotional feedback on a timeless wavelength, Bearing a gift beyond price...almost free."

-Rock Group RUSH

The lyrics written above, taken from a song called "Spirit of the Radio", seem to best express my feelings about this hobby. (Oh great, here goes VSG off onto another one of his ham-radio-asmetaphor tangents. How did you wind up with this metaphysical idiot anyway?)

Not really. These are just notes from a new ham radio operator. Just observations I have gathered throughout this first year that I have been involved in the hobby. I think the most striking obsevation so far, to me at least, is that I am meeting more and more hams who seem to have lost that "sense of wonder" that must have drawn them to this hobby when they began. Here's a perfect example of what I mean.

I had not been on HF for very long, perhaps two weeks after I bought my first HF rig (a Realistic HTX-100 ten-meter job, used, and worth every penny I paid for it), when I finally made my first DX contact. I nearly fell out of my chair, and missed several minutes of copy, when the guy sent "...QTH here is Victoria, B.C., Canada," which in that moment, at least as far as I was concerned, was probably the most exotic and wonderful place on the face of the earth. I sent back a "UR my first DX contact..." and spent the next fourty-five minutes—to this day the happiest fourty-five minutes I've spent operating a ham radio—ragchewing with this guy from Canada.

I shut the ten-meter rig off and turned the two-meter rig on almost at the same time. I was so bursting with excitement that I couldn't think of anything better to do than to share the moment with other people who would understand. Other hams.

"Hey guess what! I just made my first DX contact. Victoria, British Columbia, Canada!"

Mic unkeyed. Still smiling.

"You call that DX?"

So what.

Big deal.

I've got worked all counties, worked all states, worked all ham radio operators who are left handed and own small lap dogs, bounced a signal off of every planet in the solar system and got DXCC two-times-all-bands-all modes once while standing on my head with my eyes closed. And brother I've got the plaques to prove it.

Cool.

Not much left to do after that, is there?

Except maybe sitting around on two meters complaining about the way everybody else runs their station.

Except maybe to gather together in small groups over cups of coffee and glasses of iced tea to run down and laugh at other hams who are not there until they show up late and then they are our friends.

Lot of fun, that.

Is it my imagination or has this article gone invidious while I wasn't looking. Does this guy have some major kind of chip on his shoulder or what?

Not really. It just worries me. You see, I'm still new to ham radio. Ham radio makes me feel like I did as a kid...on warm summer evenings laying in the grass out in the back yard with chiggers munching on my butt...gazing up into the night sky and wondering is there anybody out there?

Can you hear me?

Hello?

It's about that sense of wonder. Not how the radio works; not how we establish communication, but why. About one year and some 450 contacts after I first got on HF, I still get butterflies in my stomach when another station answers my CQ. I still tense up a little bit when they send "The QTH here is..." Is it a new state? Is it DX? Is it a station that I have worked before?

As a new ham I wonder...can I do too much? Can I accomplish so much in this hobby that eventually it has no meaning?

God I hope not.

"You call that DX?"

The answer, sir, is yes. As a matter of fact I do.
